2. The US House has 435 seats total that are divided between the 50 states based on their population size.
3. US Senators are voted for every 6 years, while US Representatives are voted on every 2 years.
4. US Congress write and votes on nationwide legislation to provide the laws of our country.
5. To become a Senator you must be at least 30 years old, have been a citizen of the U.S. for the last 9 years, and must be a resident of the state that you represent.
6. Becoming a House Representative requires the same things, except you only have to be 25 years old!
7. The United States Vice-President also serves as President of the Senate.
8. The Speaker of the House is the leader of the House of Representatives.
9. The United States Congress is split up into a bicameral (2 part) system: US Senate and US House of Representatives.
